MONDAY JULY 20TH 2009: WORKSHOP INTRODUCING SITUATIONAL ANALYSIS

Situational Analysis is a new grounded theory approach that takes into account the postmodern turn. It offers three ways of mapping a situation of enquiry, providing fresh ways into social science data. The mapping techniques in Situational Analysis supplement traditional grounded theory approaches that centre on action—basic social processes. Instead, these maps centre on **the situation of enquiry**. Through mapping the data, the analyst constructs the situation of enquiry empirically. The situation per se becomes the ultimate unit of analysis and understanding its elements and their relations are the primary goals.

This workshop does not presume any knowledge of situational analysis. All are welcome, although you will need some basic knowledge of qualitative enquiry to benefit.

TUESDAY JULY 21ST 2009: MASTER CLASS APPLYING SITUATIONAL ANALYSIS IN YOUR PROJECTS

On day two, 15 people who would like to use (or are using) situational analysis in their projects will participate in a Master Class. Participants in this class will work with Professor Clarke to practice and/or plan mapping **their own situations of study**. Master Class participants will be selected based on their applications, and must attend the workshop on Monday July 20th. The application form is overleaf.

Two PhD Scholars, selected by a competitive process, will be supported to attend. These two scholars will have their attendance fees waived, and will receive a copy of Prof Clarke's Book *Situational Analysis* (Sage, 2005) and \$400 towards accommodation and travel expenses.

To be eligible for this support you must attend both days and provide proof of current enrolment in a PhD program.

ABOUT ADELE E. CLARKE

Adele E. Clarke is Professor of Sociology and Adjunct Professor of History of Health Sciences at the University of California, San Francisco. Trained by Anselm Strauss, she has been using and teaching grounded theory since 1980. She has been pushing and pulling grounded theory around the postmodern turn by developing innovative cartographic and positional approaches, focusing on the situation as the unit of analysis, and turning to the analysis of discourses.

Clarke's research has focused on social, cultural, and historical studies of science, technology, and medicine. She is particularly interested in biomedicalization and common medical technologies pertinent to women's health such as contraception and the Pap smear.



In addition to *Situational Analysis: Grounded Theory After the Postmodern Turn* (Sage, 2005), she is the author of *Disciplining Reproduction: American Life Scientists and the 'Problem of Sex'* (University of California Press, 1998). She also co-edited *The Right Tools for the Job: At Work in Twentieth Century Life Sciences* (Princeton University Press, 1992), *Women's Health: Complexities and Diversities* (Ohio State University Press, 1997), and *Revisoning Women, Health and Healing: Cultural, Feminist and Technoscience Perspectives* (Routledge, 1999). Clarke's collaborative work on biomedicalization in the U.S. appeared in *American Sociological Review* 68(April):161-194. A co-edited volume of case studies is due out this year: *Biomedicalization: Technoscience, Health and Illness in the U.S.* (Duke University Press). Her latest book is: Jan Morse, Phyllis N. Stern, Juliet Corbin, Barbara Bowers, Kathy Charmaz, and Adele E. Clarke *Developing Grounded Theory: The Second Generation* (Left Coast Press, 2008).
